Regular verbs

- To form the PAST of a regular verb, you must add -ED to the verb: OPEN - OPENED
- There are just few exceptions:
- 1. DANCE + D = DANCED
- 2. STUDY (C+y-IED) = STUDIED
- 3. STOP (1 syllable c+v+c)= STOPPED
- There is no actual conjugation:
- I/you/he/she/it/we/you/they OPENED

• «To Be» is the only irregular verb with a conjugation:

- I was
- You were
- He she it was
- We were
- You were
- They were

English Study The Past Simple with "be"

Positive with 'be'	Negative with 'be'	Negative Short Form
I was cold.	I was not sleepy.	l wasn't sleepy.
You were tired.	You were not on the bus.	You weren't on the bus.
He was in the garden.	He was not at school.	He wasn't at school.
He was late.	He was not ugly.	He wasn't ugly.
It <mark>was</mark> rainy.	It was not hot.	lt wasn't hot.
We were on holiday.	We were not at work.	We weren't at work.
They were hungry.	They were not tired.	They weren't tired.

Irregular verbs

- Irregular verbs have paradigms. For example the paradigm of to EAT is :
- To <u>EAT</u> (infinitive) <u>ATE</u> (past) <u>EATEN</u> (past participle)
- Even with irregular verbs there is no actual conjugation: I/you/he/she/it/we/you/they ATE

Questions and Negatives with the Past

 To make guestions and negatives you need DID (with the exception of the auxiliary verbs). Did must be followed by the • REG: She opened the door. infinitive of the verb with no TO **DID** she open the door? She DID not open the door. • IRR : She ATE an apple. DID she eat an apple? She DID not eat an apple.
