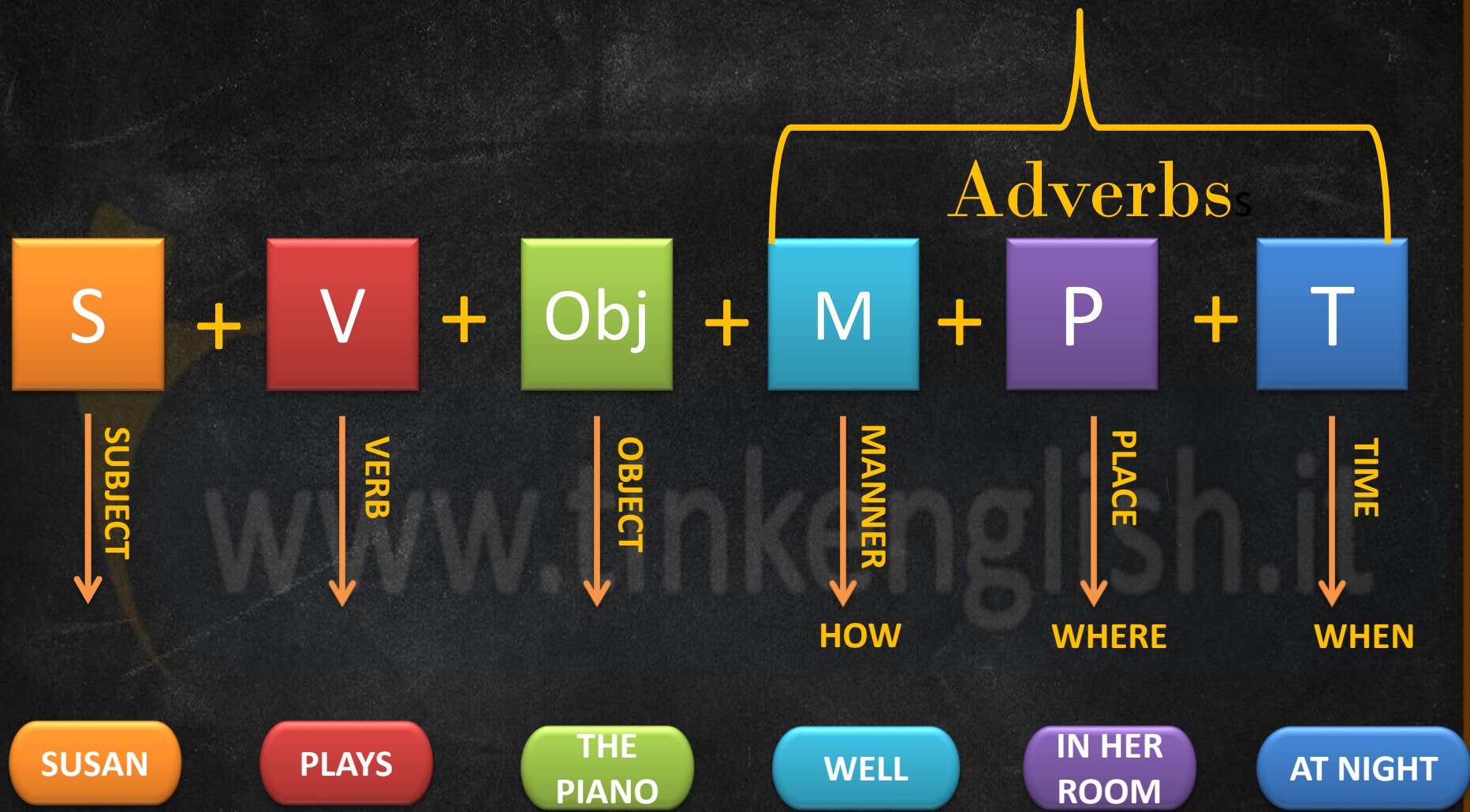


Let's start to

REMEMBER! You must always start the sentence with a subject!

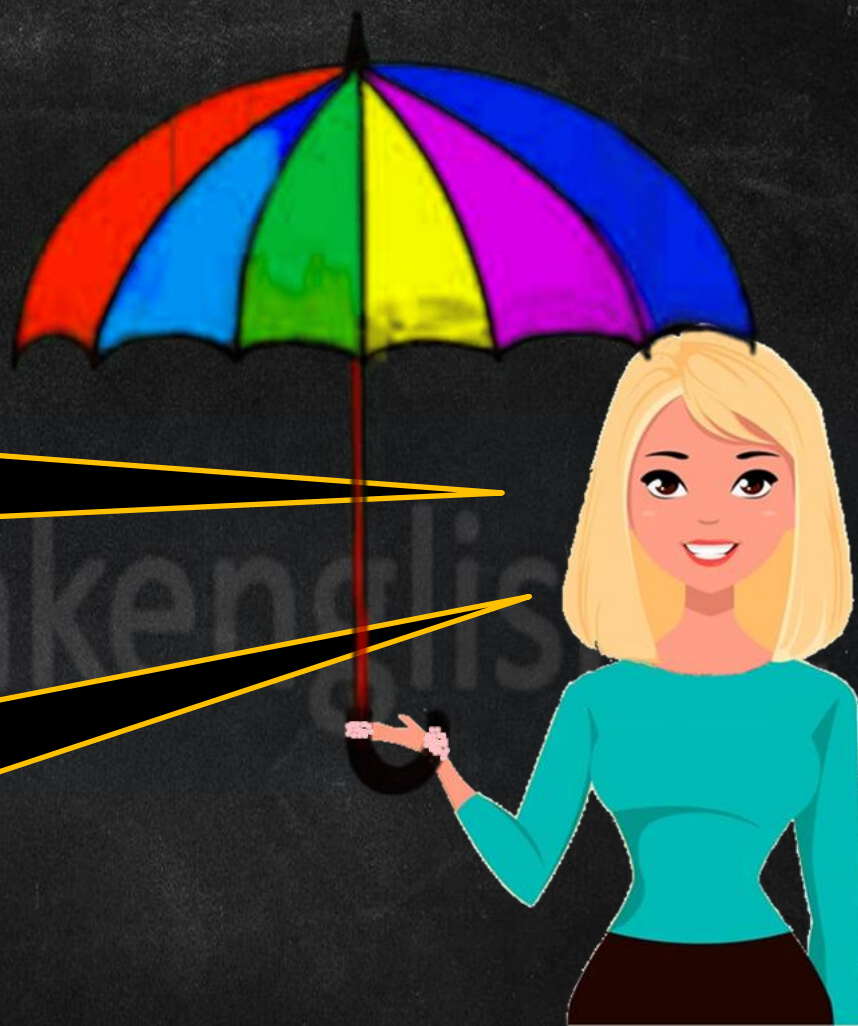
Verbs in English are not conjugated like in Italian

Hence, a subject is always required not to get confused!



If I need to translate:
«*guarda la televisione*»,
the point is, who is
watching the tv: He ?
She?It? (Even a cat can
watch the tv, after all)

Or if I want to translate
: «*piove*», even in this
case I will need a
subject: « *IT is
raining*»!
